Definition:

'Dependant' means in relation to any member:

1. the wife, husband, civil partner, widow or widower of the relevant member;
2. any child of the relevant member who at the date of the member's death or retirement (as the case may be) had not reached the age of 18 or who at that date was still in full-time education or vocational training, but only until such child reaches 18 or ceases to be in full-time education or vocational training, whichever is the later, unless the child would, by reason of Incapacity, have continued to be dependent on the member after reaching 18;
3. any child of the relevant member who at the date of the member's death or retirement (as the case may be) had reached 18 but, by reason of Incapacity, continued to be dependent on the member;
4. any individual not falling within 1-3 above who, in the opinion of the Trustees, is at the date of the member's death or retirement (as the case may be) wholly or substantially dependent on the member for support or maintenance (whether by reason of Incapacity or otherwise); and
5. any individual not falling within 1-3 above who, in the opinion of the Trustees, at the date of the member's death or retirement (as the case may be) was in a relationship with the member such that they were financially interdependent and the individual's standard of living depended on the combined income of the member and such individual.

In this definition, 'child' means a legally adopted child as well as a natural child.
